A valid identification needs to be provided. They offer a Free Fall and Winter enrichment camp for families that qualify.

Kelly Gonez - LAUSD Representative

The entire Superintendent Search Community Engagement Report is now available on website: achieve.lausd.net/suptsearch2021, which was used to develop a job description for the superintendent and the election criteria that are reflective of LA Unified Community Input and are publicly available on the website.

Street teams visited more than 120 school sites to directly help parents and students fill out surveys during drop off and pick up.

In order to protect the LA Unified community against Covid 19. a 97% compliance has been reached with the employee vaccination requirement. It was above 99% for classroom teachers and principals.

The LAUSD Board voted to require eligible students who are 12 years and older to be vaccinated at the start of the second semester.

State of California will be requiring employees and eligible students in all schools public and private, to be vaccinated next school year.

The district has launched mobile vaccination teams that have visited and continue to visit every middle and high school campus. Locations can be seen at achieve.lausd.net/covid vaccineappt.

Eligible students have until January 10, 2022 to get two doses of the vaccine.

Students 5-11 are now eligible to receive their vaccine which remains voluntary at this time.

Vaccinations are offered at school sites for this group.
