

North Hollywood LAPD Part I crime data for 2010, 2011, 2015, and 2019 is based on the LAPD "Crime Data from 2010 to 2019" dataset, which is publicly available online on City of Los Angeles Open Data Portal. Current North Hollywood LAPD Part I and II crime data is based on LAPD "Crime Data from 2020 to Present" dataset. Statistics are based on the date the crime occurred.

**Laurel Grove** (LAPD Basic Car 15A33) includes Laurel Grove and neighborhoods from Coldwater to Colfax > Kittridge to Burbank.

**Valley Village** (LAPD Basic Car 15A43) includes Valley Village and neighborhoods from Coldwater to Hollywood Fwy > Burbank to Ventura Fwy.

**Studio City** (LAPD Basic Car 15A85) includes Studio City and neighborhoods from Coldwater to Hollywood Fwy > Ventura Fwy to Mulholland.

<sup>c</sup> <u>Proposition 47</u> (passed 11/4/2014) - Proposition 47 reduces certain drug possession felonies to misdemeanors. It also requires misdemeanor sentencing for petty theft and receiving stolen property, when the amount involved is \$950 or less.

An LAPD Internal Audit Report (released 12/2015) details serious aggravated assaults misclassified as minor offenses in an eight-year period. In 10/2014, a new LAPD Data Integrity Unit was formed and detailed flowcharts were created to provide step-by-step instructions deciding how assaults should be classified.


**Proposition 57** (passed 11/8/2016) - Proposition 57 allows parole consideration for non-violent felons, changes policies on juvenile prosecution, and authorizes sentence credits for rehabilitation, good behavior, and education.

FAN L.A. Times article (3/21/2017) reports LAPD is concerned that fewer crimes may be reported amid a climate of fear in immigrant communities.


<sup>6</sup> Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Gov. Gavin Newsom issued a statewide Stay-At-Home order on 3/19/2020. A new regional Stay-At-Home order took effect on 12/5/2020.

<sup>H</sup> On 1/25/2021, the California Department of Public Health announced the end of the statewide Stay-at-Home Order, which returns each county to the tiered reopening structure. On 6/15/2021, capacity and distancing requirements were lifted for most businesses and activities in California.


As a result of a class-action lawsuit filed by multiple nonprofits and public interest law firms against LAPD, L.A. County Courts have implemented a zero-bail system as of 10/1/2023 for defendants accused of non-violent or non-serious crimes. The new policy eliminates the existing cash bail system between their arrest and their arraignment for all but the most serious of crimes in the county.








Aggravated Assault: An attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury.




Homicide: Murder and non-negligent manslaughter — the willful killing of one human being by another.

NOTE: In 2013, the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting Guidelines definition of rape was changed. The revised definition includes both male and female victims and offenders, and reflects the various forms of sexual assault understood to be rape.



Robbery: The taking of anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person by force or fear.





<u>Part I Crime</u>: The law enforcement term for serious and/or violent crimes that includes auto theft, burglary, personal theft, aggravated assault, homicide, sex crimes, and robbery, which comply with the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting Guidelines.

<u>Part II Crime</u>: Includes trespassing, vandalism, and simple assault. Also disorderly conduct, embezzlement, extortion, forgery and counterfeiting, fraud, identity theft, kidnapping, offenses against the family, prostitution, sex offenses, stolen property, and weapons offenses.

In 11/1/2022 – 10/31/2023, North Hollywood LAPD reported **6,558** Part I Crimes. An additional **4,399** Part II Crimes were also reported in North Hollywood for an overall total of **10,957** Part I and Part II Crimes during the past 12-months.





North Hollywood LAPD logged **46,956** calls for service during the past 12-months per the "LAPD Calls for Service" dataset on the City of Los Angeles Open Data Portal.





<u>Burglary From Vehicle</u>: Auto <u>Burglary</u> is defined as forcing entry into a <u>locked</u> vehicle with the intent to steal property. <u>Theft From Motor Vehicle</u>: <u>Theft</u> from Motor Vehicle is defined as stealing property from an <u>unlocked</u> vehicle.

Catalytic Converter Theft is reported primarily under Burglary Theft From Vehicle (BTFV) Part I Crimes beginning in 1/2011 (North Hollywood LAPD MO Code 385 data is not available for 2012 and 2016).

NOTE: MO Code 385 "Suspect Removed Parts from Vehicle" may include Catalytic Converter and other vehicle parts. Per USC's Crosstown data project, Catalytic Converters aren't the only parts thieves take: Headlamps and airbags also go missing, but Catalytic Converters appear to account for the vast majority of recent thefts.

NOTE: In 9/2022, Governor Gavin Newsom signed two new laws (SB 1087 and AB 1740), which will increase penalties for buyers who fail to certify that a Catalytic Converter wasn't stolen. As of 1/1/2023, it will be illegal in California to buy Catalytic Converters from anyone other than licensed auto dismantlers or dealers.





<u>Identity Theft</u>: The unauthorized use of personal identifying information such as name, address, credit card information, driver's license, social security number. or other personal data to obtain credit, medical information, property, goods, or services. No financial loss is necessary. Per LAPD Online, Identity Theft crime location should be reported as the filer's home residence address regardless of where the crime is believed to have occurred.

#### **EXAMPLES OF IDENTITY THEFT:**

Stealing mail from your mailbox or breaking into your vehicle to obtain newly issued credit cards, bank and credit card statements, pre-approved credit offers, or tax or other personal or financial information.

Dumpster diving in your trash containers for discarded credit card or loan applications to apply for credit in your name.

Thieves will "skim" cards at restaurants, stores, gas stations, or bank ATMs to get information out of credit or debit cards.

They also will try to steal information, so they can apply for EDD Unemployment or Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) cards.

#### **HOW TO AVOID IDENTITY THEFT:**

LAPD suggests people carry only one credit card in their wallet, pay bills electronically, and never give out personal information over the phone.

Use online paperless options for monthly banking and credit card statements, if available.

Shred unwanted credit card applications and any document with personal financial information.

Cover the keypad when punching in a PIN number at a bank ATM machine or other location.

Use contactless payment or the tap option on credit or debit card readers, when possible.


Consider placing a security or credit freeze on your credit file at the three credit bureaus (Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion). This will prevent prospective creditors from accessing your credit file and prevent others from opening accounts in your name without your authorization.

#### **WHAT SHOULD YOU DO IF IDENTITY THEFT OCCURS:**

If you notice unusual financial activity or transactions indicating identity theft, contact your bank and the three credit bureaus (Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion) immediately.

Also notify North Hollywood LAPD (identity theft crimes may be reported online to LAPD).







An LAPD Internal Audit Report (released 12/2015) details serious aggravated assaults misclassified as minor offenses in an eight-year period. In 10/2014, a new LAPD Data Integrity Unit was formed and detailed flowcharts were created to provide step-by-step instructions deciding how assaults should be classified.

From 2010 to 2013, **17.3%** of Assaults were classified as Part I Aggravated Assaults in North Hollywood; From 2015 to 2023, **30.1%** of Assaults were classified as Part I Aggravated Assaults in North Hollywood.

Per the LAPD Assault "Decision Tree" issued in 2014, if a weapon is used or brandished during an attack (firearm, knife, baseball bat, bottle, Taser, etc.), the assault is classified as a Part I Aggravated Assault. If no weapon is used (hands/fist, teeth, feet, or verbal), but the injury is serious (broken bones, internal injury, stitches, or strangulation), the assault is also classified as a Part I Aggravated Assault, which is included under FBI Uniform Crime Reporting Guidelines.

If no weapon is used (hands/fist, teeth, feet, or verbal) and the injury is less serious (abrasions, minor lacerations, contusions/bruises, or intimidation/fear), the assault is classified as a Part II Simple Assault.

<u>Intimate Partner Assault</u>: Historically called "Domestic Violence," "Intimate Partner Assault" describes physical, sexual, or psychological harm by a current or former intimate partner or spouse according to the National Institute of Justice. This type of violence can occur among heterosexual or same-sex couples.

Intimate Partner Assault is reported under Part I Aggravated Assault and Part II Simple Assault Crimes.

An LAPD Internal Audit Report (released 12/2015) details serious aggravated assaults misclassified as minor offenses in an eight-year period. In 10/2014, a new LAPD Data Integrity Unit was formed and detailed flowcharts were created to provide step-by-step instructions deciding how assaults should be classified.

From 2010 to 2013, **2.1%** of Intimate Partner Assaults were classified as Part I Aggravated Assaults in North Hollywood; From 2015 to 2023, **16.8%** of Intimate Partner Assaults were classified as Part I Aggravated Assaults in North Hollywood.

Overall, about 30% of Total Part I and II Assaults are classified as Intimate Partner Assaults in North Hollywood.
