NoHo Home Alliance will utilize grant money received to operate the Drop-In Access Center for people experiencing homelessness, maximizing the number of unhoused persons receiving stabilization & housing services in the North Hollywood West neighborhoods. The Access Center's success comes from NoHo Homes deep experience and existing relationships with the unhoused population in the East Valley community. At the Access Center unhoused neighbors will have access to bathrooms & showers, hot meals, mail & phone charging, clothing, as well as housing stabilization, physical and mental health services.

NoHo Home Alliance is a hyper-local organization serving the unhoused neighbors in the East San Fernando Valley. Our services are the pathway to building relationships with our unhoused neighbors. We nurture community with the understanding that change becomes possible in the context of safe, reliable relationships that affirm human dignity.
